


English	<p><b>English Week</b></p> <p><b>Reader's Theatre</b> It's a way to involve students in reading aloud. In reader's theatre, students "perform" by reading scripts created from grade-level books or stories. Usually, they do so without costumes or props. This strategy combines reading practice and performing.</p> <p><b>Goal:</b> To enhance students' reading skills and confidence by having them practice reading with a purpose. Reader's theatre gives students a real reason to read aloud.</p> <p><b>Jazz Chant</b> is a rhythmic expression of natural language which links the rhythms of spoken American English to the rhythms of traditional American jazz. Jazz Chants are defined poems with repeated beats. The beat may vary depending on the idea of the reader.</p> <p><b>Goal:</b> To improve students' speaking ability in reading aloud (students' reading is recorded one = aloud) especially vocal sounds)</p>

## Mechanics and Rubric for Prepared Speech



Student's topic for Prepared Speaking is going to be chosen by draw lots.

Mechanics:

1. The speaking order of the contestants and the topics for speaking are going to be determined by a draw of lots.
2. The style of delivery shall be conversational, oratorical or a combination of both.
3. Time allotted for the speech is 1 minute.
4. Timing begins with the first word uttered by the contestant and stops at the last word. At the end of the 1 minute, there will be a grace period of 30 seconds. There will be no visible or audible signal at the end of the grace period. Any contestant who speaks less than 1 minute or more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  a minute will be disqualified.
5. Judges' decision is final and irrevocable.
6. Any protests or complaints must be lodged with the Judge **prior to the announcement of results**. Protests are limited to the contestants and judges. No protests or complaints will be entertained after the announcement of results.

**Scoring by the Judges will conform to the following criteria:**

1. Speech Value (Originality of Ideas, Logical Presentation and Support Materials)- 20 marks
2. Speech Development (Structure- Opening, Body and Conclusion)- 20 marks
3. Voice and Body Language (Voice Modulation, Gestures, and Facial Expression)- 20 marks
4. Language and Pronunciation (Grammar, Word Choice and Enunciation)- 20 marks
5. Overall Effectiveness of Speech (Achievement of Purpose)- 20 marks
